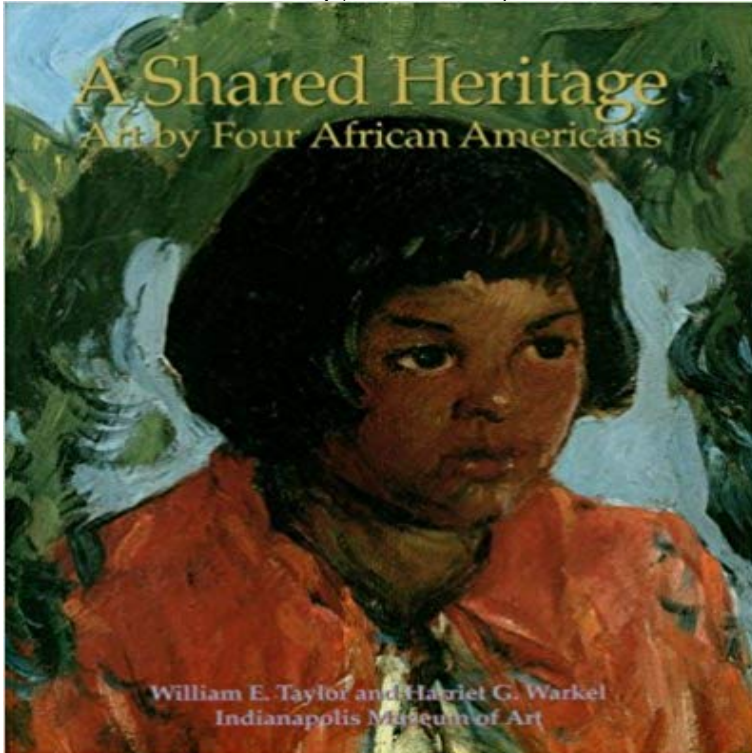


A Shared Heritage: Art by Four African Americans
